

## **Anna Radyo Interview Guide**

**0:16** Anna Radyo recalls her experiences growing up in the Ukrainian community in Edmonton and meeting the individuals in the Hromada Women's Group.

**7:20** Radyo discusses how she was introduced to feminism through her sister's activity at the University of Alberta. She also introduces Common Woman Books and her clothing store Zoryana.

**10:30** Radyo describes the story of how she opened Zoryana, what it looked like, and how it functioned within the community.

**17:00** Radyo describes her memories of Common Woman Books.

**22:20** Radyo recalls how she first learned about the Hromada Women's Group and how the women in the group profoundly influenced her life.

**28:50** Radyo recalls how the women in the Hromada Women's Group decided to start the Hromada Housing Co-op and describes the process of making the idea a reality. She also discusses daily life in the Hromada Housing Co-op.

**37:45** Radyo describes the impact of these initiatives on the Ukrainian community and her sense of Ukrainian identity. She emphasizes that these initiatives added another voice and perspective to the Ukrainian community in Edmonton.

**44: 50** Radyo reflects on the challenges she encountered during this period of her life and the brightest possible future for the Ukrainian Canadian community.
