0:20 A brief historical overview of Eastern Europe during the interwar and World War II period to contextualize the third wave of Ukrainian immigration to Canada.

9:35 Dr. Petryshyn places his parents within this historical framework.

15:00 Introduction to Dr. Petryshyn's father (Alexander Petryshyn) who was formative in Dr. Petryshyn's life

23:30 A historical overview of Polish-Ukrainian relations in the interwar period

Dr. Petryshyn mentions the book: Kuchabsky, Vasyl. *Western Ukraine in Conflict with Poland and Bolshevism 1918-1920*. Edmonton: CIUS Press, 2009.

29:00 Dr. Petryshyn's recollections about Alexander Petryshyn's activities and political influences during the interwar period. Included are stories about how the family struggled against both the Polish and Soviet regimes. Dr. Petryshyn also discusses how stories from this period were passed down within the Petryshyn household.

43:35 Dr. Petryshyn's experience growing up within the Ukrainian community in Fort William, (now Thunder Bay) Canada.

57:12 An overview and history of the Ukrainian community, organizations, and politics within Thunder Bay. Included are stories about both Alexander and Roman Petryshyn's activist activity within the Ukrainian diaspora and broader society.

1:24:30 Introduction to Dr. Petryshyn's mother (Stephania Zelinska) and her influence on Dr. Petryshyn. The story of how Stephania and Alexander met and married.

1:50:00 Dr. Petryshyn's recollections of his parents' stories about their experiences during World War II.
